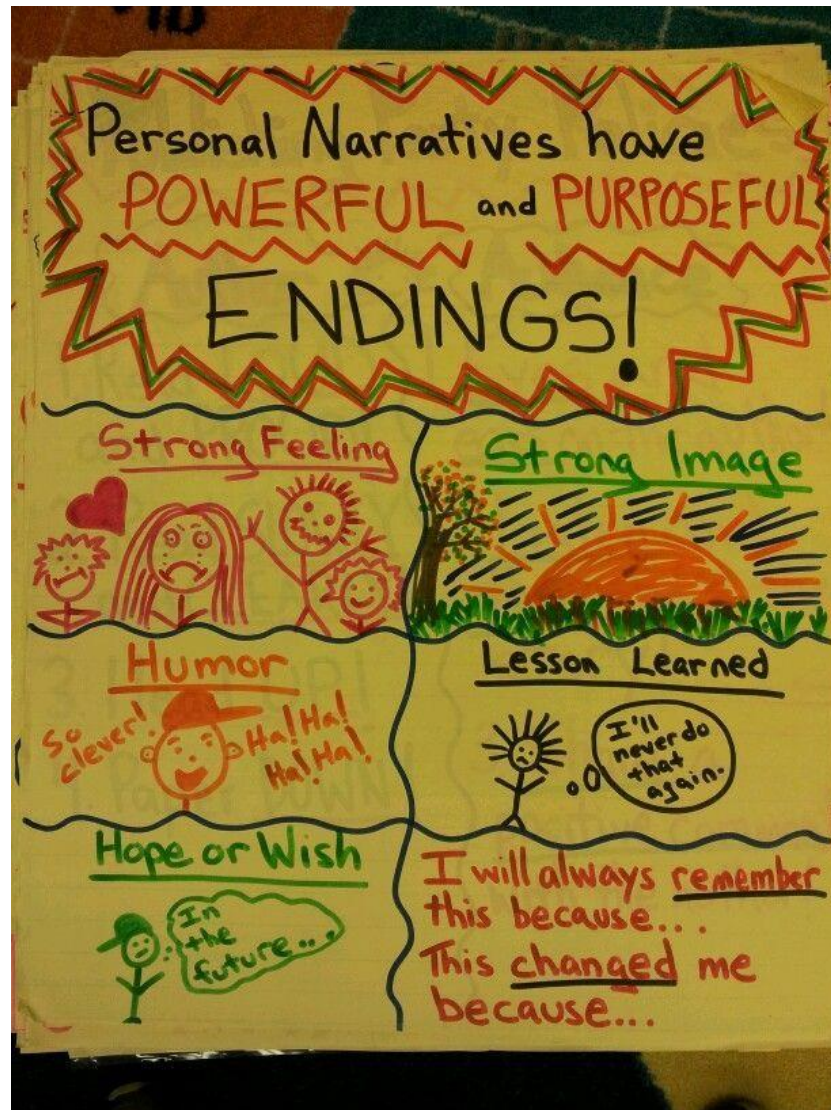

my teacher assigns.

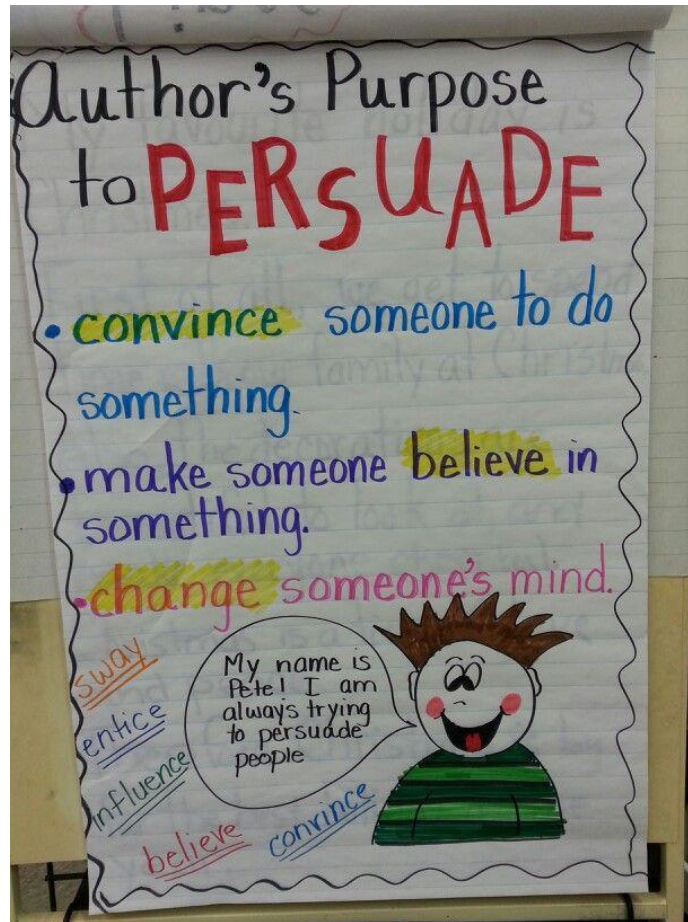
Homework! Oh, homework!
